Recipe of the Month.....

Seven Layer Salad

2 cups mayonnaise, spread over peas, covering to edge of dish

8 oz. shredded cheese, sprinkle over mayonnaise.

Senior Center Board Report for July 2014

Meals: 514 meals were served to 91 attendees.

Transportation: 516 one way trips were provided to 80 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 20 units for 6 clients.

<u>Adult Day Care</u>: There were a total of 182 trips provided for 6 clients.

Home Meals: There were 3499 home meals delivered to 129clients.

Supportive Services: There were 63 units for 27 clients.

<u>Socialization/Recreation</u>: There were 99 different activities and 265 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 830 Hours for 112 clients.

<u>Total transportation miles</u>: We traveled 8928 miles transporting clients.

<u>Total miles delivering meals</u>: We traveled 3826 miles delivering meals.

building. To enable us to keep the bin we need everyone to place their old newspapers, magazines, junk mail and shredding into the dumpster! Spread the word to your friends and family, they can


