Meals: 527 meals were served to 123 attendees.

<u>Transportation</u>: 488 one way trips were provided to 89 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 10 units for 2 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 175 trips provided for 6 clients.

Home Meals: There were 2948 home meals delivered to 107 clients.

Supportive Services: There were 83 units for 50 clients.

Socialization/Recreation: There were 115 different activities and 236

clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 739.25 hours for 120 clients.

Total transportation miles: We traveled 9133 miles transporting cli-

ents.



RECIPIE OF THE MONTH

ALMOND JOY BROWNIE BITES

Ingredients

Brownie batter

- 4 cups sweetened flaked coconut
- 14 oz. sweetened condensed milk
- 4 dozen almonds
- Chocolate almond bark

Directions

- Preheat oven according to brownie recipe and generously spray two mini muffin pans with nonstick spray.
- Fill cups about 1/2 full with brownie batter and bake according to directions. When brownies are done, place pans on a cooling rack and remove brownies once cooled.
- 3. In a medium bowl, combine coconut and sweetened condensed milk.
- With clean hands, roll coconut mixture into balls and press onto tops of brownie bites.
- 5. Press an almond into the top of each.
- 6. Place brownies in freezer to harden for about 15 minutes.
- Melt almond bark or candy melts according to directions.
- Remove brownies from freezer and dip the tops in the chocolate.
- Place dipped brownies on a wax paper lined baking sheet and refrigerate until chocolate is set.

items in the dumpster too!


