Senior Center Board Report for November 2015

Meals: 495 meals were served to 104 attendees.

<u>Transportation</u>: 290 one way trips were provided to 49 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 6 units for 3 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 156 trips provided for 8 cli-

ents.

Home Meals: There were 2183 home meals delivered to 86 clients.

Supportive Services: There were 50.25 units for 42 clients.

Socialization/Recreation: There were 111.5 different activities and 152 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 880.75 units for 140 clients.

<u>Total transportation miles</u>: We traveled 10501 miles transporting clients.

<u>Total miles delivering meals</u>: We traveled 3046 miles delivering meals.



January Recipe.....

Potato Bacon Chowder Recipe

1 lb. potatoes, peeled and cubed

1 cup water

8 bacon strips

1 medium onion, chopped

1 celery rib, chopped

1 can cream of chicken soup, undiluted

1-3/4 cups whole milk

1 cup sour cream

1/2 tsp. salt

Dash pepper

1 tbsp. minced fresh parsley

Place potatoes in a small saucepan and cover with the water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and cook for 10 to 15 minutes or until tender.

In a large skillet, cook bacon until crisp; drain.

In same skillet, sauté onion and celery in drippings until tender; drain. Add to undrained potatoes. Stir in the soup, milk and sour cream, salt and pepper. Cook over low heat for 10 minutes or until heated through. (do not boil)

Crumble bacon; set aside 1/4 cup. Add remaining bacon to soup along with parsley. Sprinkle with reserved bacon. Yield: 6 servings.




