



Senior Center Board Report for October 2016

Meals: 534 meals were served to 98 attendees.

Transportation: 412 one way trips were provided to 64 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 9 units for 4 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 187 trips provided for 8 cli-

ents.

Home Meals: There were 2600 home meals delivered to 101 clients.

<u>Supportive Services</u>: There were 71.75 units for 39 clients.

<u>Socialization/Recreation</u>: There were 100.75 different activities and 157 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 961 units for 141 clients.

<u>Total transportation miles</u>: We traveled 4925 miles transporting clients.

<u>Total miles delivering meals</u>: We traveled 2596 miles delivering meals.

4-Ingredient Snickerdoodle Bars

1 roll (16.5 oz) Pillsbury refrigerated sugar Cookies

1 1/4 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon sugar

1 container (16 oz) vanilla creamy frosting



Heat oven to 350 degrees. Let cookie dough stand at room temp. 10 minutes to soften. Spray 8-inch square pan with cooking spray. In medium bowl, mix cookie dough and 1 tsp. of cinnamon with wooden spoon or hands until well blended. Press evenly in pan. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until set and edges are golden brown. Cool completely, about 1 hour. Meanwhile, in small bowl, stir remaining 1/4 tsp. cinnamon and sugar until well blended. Spread frosting on bars. Sprinkle with cinnamon-sugar. Cut into bars.
