Supplemental Food Program Accepting Applications

The Senior Center is a distribution site for the "Commodity Supplemental Food Program".

We currently have spots available on the waiting list. Clinton County residents age 60 + meeting the income guidelines are eligible. Applications will be accepted Tuesday, February 21 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and Thursday, February 23 from 12:00 noon to 3:00 p.m.

Please bring your proof of age and residency. Proof of income is not required as you declare your income eligibility by signing the application.

If you qualify, you will receive a letter confirming your spot on the waiting list.

The food program gives eligible recipients a box of grocery items—including fruits, vegetables, cereal, juice, other items and a 2 lb. box of cheese.

Senior Center Board Report for December 2016

Meals: 596 meals were served to 97 attendees.

Transportation: 306 one way trips were provided to 49 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 12 units for 3 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 182 trips provided for 9 clients

Home Meals: There were 2648 home meals delivered to 112 clients.

Supportive Services: There were 62 units for 28 clients.

Socialization/Recreation: There were 90.75 different activities and 136 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 961 units for 141 clients.

<u>Total transportation miles</u>: We traveled 5035 miles transporting clients.

<u>Total miles delivering meals</u>: We traveled 2820 miles delivering meals.



Trip to Krohn's Conservatory to see the 2017 Spring Show—"Blooms on the Bayou" on Thursday, March 9. We will depart the Center at 9:30 a.m. Cost for trip is \$8 — which includes admission to show and transportation. We will stop on return trip at Mimi's Café for lunch.

The show Blooms on the Bayou is inspired by the colorful culture of New Orleans, which features both a fun, festive side of the "Big Easy" as well as the eerie, yet enchanting, swampy southern bayou. Wander down our bayou boardwalk in the midst of bald cypress trees, blossoming bog lilies, and Spanish moss to explore the mysterious river shack or dance to some Dixieland jazz in the traditional New Orleans courtyard surrounded by Crepe Myrtle and Magnolia trees glittered with beads. Hundreds of vibrant annuals animate this display with charming camellias, dazzling tulips, fragrant hyacinths, and illustrious ferns of the French Quarter. Let this display take you away to the warm southern spring of the Louisiana bayou.

TRIP TO LACOMEDIA—Sunday, March 5, 2017. We will be seeing the third installment of the Church Basement Ladies—"Away in the Basement". Set during the 1959 Sunday School Christmas program, the ladies are working on goodie bags and Nativity pieces while the children rehearse. Lots of laughs are in store as the ladies mend old bathrobes and discuss the politics of who's going to play the various roles. Cost for the Sunday brunch is \$43—which includes ticket for show, meal and transportation. Money and reservations are due by February 5.

HISTORY OF VALENTINE'S DAY

No one knows for sure about the origins of Valentine's Day. One theory is that it came from an ancient Roman celebration called Lupercalia that began on February 15. Lupercalia celebrated springtime and fertility. On February 14th, it was a custom for young Roman males to draw the names of girls to be their partners during the festival's celebrations the next day. The most popular theory about the origin of Valentine's Day is that it was named after St. Valentine. The story dates back to the third century, AD. Emperor Claudius II decreed that no one could marry or become engaged because he needed more soldiers for his army. A young Roman priest named Valentine defied the Emperor's decree by secretly marrying love-struck couples. He was arrested, imprisoned and sentenced to death.

While in prison, Valentine was especially friendly to the blind jailer's daughter and by a miracle restored her sight. The morning of his execution, he sent her a message signed, "From Your Valentine." He was executed on February 14 and was buried by an almond tree which bloomed pink flowers as a symbol of everlasting love.



Tin Roof Pie

3/4 cup caramel ice cream topping, divided

3/4 cup cocktail peanuts, chopped, divided

4 cups vanilla ice cream, softened

1 ready-to-use chocolate flavor crumb crust

(6 oz.)
