Senior Center Board Report for March 2017

Meals: 585 meals were served to 81 attendees.

Transportation: 364 one way trips were provided to 63 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 16 units for 4 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 190 trips provided for 10 clients.

Home Meals: There were 2729 home meals delivered to 110 clients.

Supportive Services: There were 57.5 units for 15 clients.

Socialization/Recreation: There were 115.5 different activities and 145 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 961 units for 141 clients.

<u>Total transportation miles</u>: We traveled 5035 miles transporting clients.

<u>Total miles delivering meals</u>: We traveled 2820 miles delivering meals.



FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

There is a Conduct Policy in place at the Senior Center. This policy was put into effect in 2009. Since several years have passed and we have additional members, we felt it would be a good idea to make all aware of this policy.

The following is the policy as it was published in the October 2009 Senior Informer:

"The Senior Center Advisory Board and staff have developed a new policy concerning conduct while attending the Senior Center. Violence and abusive language to others WILL NOT BE TOLERATED at the Senior Center. Participants come to the Center to have fun and socialize with others and not to be victims of any type of misconduct. Effective immediately, if there is any type of abusive language toward another participant or staff member you will be asked to leave and you will not be permitted back at the Center for any activity or program for 30 days. If a violent act has occurred, that will be cause for immediate removal from the Center and your membership will be terminated."

We want the Senior Center to continue to be an enjoyable place for all to attend.
