

Meals: 483 meals were served to 78 attendees.

Transportation: 407 one way trips were provided to 38 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 17 units for 6 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 252 trips provided for 11

Home Meals: There were 2324 home meals delivered to 91 clients.

Supportive Services: There were 65.75 units for 21 clients.

Socialization/Recreation: There were 99.5 different activities and

132 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 1021.75 ESP units; 57 Clinton Maid hours

Total transportation miles: We traveled 5,670 miles transporting

clients.

If a violent act has occurred, that will be cause for immediate removal from the Center and your membership will be terminated."


