### Senior Center Board Report for April 2018

- Meals: 483 meals were served to 78 attendees.
- Transportation: 407 one way trips were provided to 38 participants.
- ESP Medical: There were 17 units for 6 clients.
- Adult Day Care: There were a total of 252 trips provided for 11 clients.
- Home Meals: There were 2324 home meals delivered to 91 clients.
- Supportive Services: There were 65.75 units for 21 clients.
- Socialization/Recreation: There were 99.5 different activities and 132 clients attending.
- Homemaking Services: 1021.75 ESP units; 57 Clinton Maid hours
- Total transportation miles: We traveled 5,670 miles transporting clients.

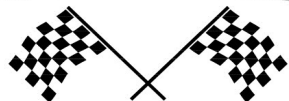

If a violent act has occurred, that will be cause for immediate removal from the Center and your membership will be terminated."
