SUMMER CRISIS PROGRAM

Bills cannot be paid if you're on Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP)

MUST HAVE CURRENT ELECTRIC BILL DUE WHEN APPLYING

The 2018-19 Summer Crisis Program will begin July 1, 2018 and run through August 31, 2018. You may qualify if your gross household size/income is as follows: 1-\$21,245, 2-\$28,805 and 3-\$36,365 and at least one household member is 60 yrs. or older or have a documented medical condition verified by a licensed physician or registered nurse practitioner (letterhead, stamped or prescription). You may also qualify for an air conditioner at this time if you have no other cooling in your home.

*Summer Crisis Program will only pay on the ELECTRIC portion of current bill.

*If client is in <u>disconnect</u>, we can pay up to \$500 to stop it <u>AFTER</u> the copay has been made.

*If client is NOT in disconnect, copay is NOT required and we can pledge up to \$500 on current electric bill.

Meals: 637 meals were served to 92 attendees.

Transportation: 367 one way trips were provided to 36 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 20 units for 4 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 277 trips provided for 12 clients.

Home Meals: There were 2222 home meals delivered to 92 clients.

<u>Supportive Services</u>: There were 50 units for 19 clients.

<u>Socialization/Recreation</u>: There were 63.75 different activities and 103 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 997.25 ESP units; 38 Clinton Maid hours

<u>Total transportation miles</u>: We traveled 5,670 miles transporting clients.

If a violent act has occurred, that will be cause for immediate removal from the Center and your membership will be terminated."


