

Senior Center Board Report for August 2018

Meals: 785 meals were served to 99 attendees.

Transportation: 337 one way trips were provided to 30 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 36 units for 7 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 244 trips provided for 11 clients.

<u>Home Meals</u>: There were 2740 home meals delivered to 108 clients. Supportive Services: There were 80.5 units for 22 clients.

Socialization/Recreation: There were 102.25 different activities and 128 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 1018.25 ESP units; 30 Clinton Maid hours

<u>Total transportation miles</u>: We traveled 5,670 miles transporting clients.

<u>Total miles delivering meals</u>: We traveled 3,234 miles delivering meals.



If a violent act has occurred, that will be cause for immediate removal from the Center and your membership will be terminated."
