Do you like auctions or know someone that does? If so, then this auction is for you!


The auction will be held on Saturday, October 12 at 10:00 a.m. Preview will be held at 9:00 a.m.



Senior Center Board Report for August 2019

Meals: 686 meals were served to 86 attendees.

Transportation: 303 one way trips were provided to 27 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 20 units for 8 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 200 trips provided for 9 clients.

<u>Home Meals</u>: There were 3043 home meals delivered to 119 clients. Supportive Services: There were 17.25 units for 16 clients.

Socialization/Recreation: There were 92.5 different activities and 132 clients attending.

Homemaking Services: 1018.25 ESP units; 30 Clinton Maid hours

<u>Total transportation miles</u>: We traveled 5,670 miles transporting clients.

<u>Total miles delivering meals</u>: We traveled 3,234 miles delivering meals.

If a violent act has occurred, that will be cause for immediate removal from the Center and your membership will be terminated."

the word to your friends and family, they can place their items in the dumpster too!






