Home Repair Assistance Available

Clinton County and the City of Wilmington have been awarded grant funds to help low-to-moderate income homeowners make improvements to their homes. Deferred/Forgivable 0% interest housing rehabilitation loans and 100% home repair grants are available for lowto-moderate income homeowners. Eligible homeowners located anywhere in Wilmington and Clinton County may apply for assistance. Household size and income limits are as follows: 1 in household: \$36,500; 2 in household: \$41,700; 3 in household: \$46,900. If you are interested in obtaining an application or learning more about the programs available, contact the Clinton County CHIP office at (937) 383-6949.

The Senior Center May be Closed But Services Continue..

Home delivered meals; homemaking services; transportation for dialysis clients and as needed medical transportation; congregate meals are available for pickup or delivery during this time; supportive services are being provided via telephone if at all possible, with home visits on a case by case basis; mobile food pantry and the supplemental food boxes are being distributed. Every effort is being put forth to protect everyone involved in provision of services—clients and staff. All staff has masks, gloves, hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes available and staff has their temperature taken prior to working each day. Take care, stay safe and let us know if there is anything we could possibly do for you. Thanks for your understanding and patience during this time.

Protecting yourself when getting prescriptions from Medicare.gov.

The CDC recommends limiting in-person visits to the pharmacy to help you protect vourself from COVID-19 when getting your prescriptions.

Here are some tips: call in prescription orders ahead of time; use drive-thru windows, curbside services, mail-order or other delivery services; try to make one trip, picking up all medicine at the same time.

During this time, you may also want to contact your Medicare prescription drug plan to see if they've temporarily waived certain requirements—such as refill limits or relaxing restrictions on home or mail delivery of prescription drugs.

Senior Center Board Report for March 2020

Meals: 449 meals were served to 60 attendees.

Transportation: 164 one way trips were provided to 33 participants.

ESP Medical: There were 0 units for 0 clients.

Adult Day Care: There were a total of 105 trips provided for 8 clients.

Home Meals: There were 5274 home meals delivered to 141 clients. Supportive Services: There were 55.75 units for 41 clients.

Socialization/Recreation: There were 38.5 different activities and 110 clients attending.

Exercise Rooms: 36 unduplicated clients used the exercise rooms.

Homemaking Services: 3325 ESP units; 21 Clinton Maid hours

Total transportation miles: We traveled 5,670 miles transporting clients.

Total miles delivering meals: We traveled 3,234 miles delivering meals.





There is a Conduct Policy in place at the Senior Center. This policy was put into effect in 2009. The Conduct Policy will be updated at the next Senior Advisory Board meeting.

The following is the policy as it was published in the October 2009 Senior Informer: "The Senior Center Advisory Board and staff have developed a new policy concerning conduct while attending the Senior Center. Violence and abusive language to others WILL NOT BE TOLERATED at the Senior Center. Participants come to the Center to have fun and socialize with others and not to be victims of any type of misconduct. Effective immediately, if there is any type of abusive language toward another participant or staff member you will be asked to leave and you will not be permitted back at the Center for any activity or program for 30 days. If a violent act has occurred, that will be cause for immediate removal from the Center and your membership will be terminated."

the word to your friends and family, they can place their items in the dumpster too!








